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ANNUAL REPORT 2013-14

The vision of ASHWINI is to have a health program for the tribals of the Gudalur Valley that is accessible, acceptable and owned by the community. It was registered as a charitable society in 1990.

The Gudalur Adivasi Hospital

In June 2013, the new block of the hospital was inaugurated by tribal elders. All basic equipment were procured and installed and were functional by the end of the year. The hospital now has a good OT block with laparoscopy facilities, labour rooms, endoscopy, digital X-ray, ultrasound and blood bank. Except for the for the blood bank licence, all necessary licences were procured.

The first laparoscopic surgery was performed by Dr Vinoo Jacob. Since then many of our friends have helped us to perform these surgeries.

With the support of Drs Ramesh and Royson from St Johns Medical College in Bangalore, the tribal staff were trained in performing audiometry and in making moulds for the hearing aids. We will soon be in a position to evaluate hearing loss and fit hearing aids at GAH.

The Community Health Programme

The Community health programme has been on a maintenance phase with no special funding this year. The focus is to encourage better usage of the Government facilities.

Malnutrition is a growing problem and discussions are under way in the villages to address this issue. With the support of GIVE India, children with malnutrition are being provided with supplemental food.

Sadly the infant deaths have also started increasing in numbers.

Alcoholism has become a widespread problem in most tribal villages; thanks to the aggressive drive by the Government to set up alcohol shops all over the state, even in the remotest villages!

The ASHWINI Institute of Health and other training programmes



The training programs are progressing extremely well. We are happy to note that more girls from the Kattunaikkan community, the most backward of all tribal groups are now coming forward for training.

13 new students enrolled for the various courses; last year's students passed with flying colours. All the eligible staff have enrolled and are getting officially certified.

The Medical Student Elective programme is going well with excellent student feedback.

2 Post graduate students from TISS, Mumbai did their internship at ASHWINI. 10 MSc nursing students from St John's Medical College in Bangalore had their placement here as part of their curriculum. Junior MBBS students from CMC, Vellore spent time here as part of their secondary hospital exposure program.

A 3 day workshop for young health professions termed "Beyond Medicine" was held at Gudalur. There was enthusiastic participation of 30 youngsters from various parts of the country.

FOGSI Tamil Nadu chapter held a one day workshop on Obstetric care. This was attended by Nurses and doctors from various organisations.

Government programmes

The mobile outreach service of the Government was discontinued by us as we felt that it was not serving any purpose. The health animators now visit villages and get to spend time with people.

TNHSP continues to reimburse the hospital the costs of all in patient tribal admissions under its "Bed Grant" program. The sickle cell programme and the tribal counsellors in PHCs continue with the support of the Government.

Staff

Dr Geeta, Dr Sheldon Rao and Dr Peter, an anaesthesiologist joined the team. Jyothi, an MSc nurse joined us to help set up the ANM training centre. 6 of the students who completed their training, have joined as staff. Mr Manikantan, a lab technician joined us to help start the Blood bank.
